

Mavis McPhee steps outside the traditional perception of educator. She reminds us that access to information, whether literacy, parenting, safety, nutrition or skill enhancement (just to list a few) is a right, not a privilege.

For over 30 years she has worked with children who have special needs; teen parents, street youth, adults and families.

In 1992, she gained her certification with the Saskatoon Adlerian Society as a parent group facilitator and since then has also received certification in several additional parenting programs including Kise-wa-to-ta-to-win Aboriginal Parenting Program, PET-Parent Effectiveness Training, and Nobody's Perfect. She has facilitated parenting groups and has worked with hundreds of parents. She also was the Teen Parent Coordinator at Saskatoon Downtown Youth Centre/EGADZ for six years working with teen mothers who faced many challenges in their lives, aside from being a young parent. .



In 2002 she joined READ Saskatoon as the Family Literacy coordinator. Today she is responsible for READ Saskatoon's Adult One-to-One Tutor Program, in which she provides supervision and support to over 300 learners and tutors. She facilitates four tutor training sessions a year as well as additional tutor in-service sessions for tutors.
