### **2010 READ Saskatoon PGI Raises \$49,000 for Literacy in Saskatoon**

**November 2, 2010** – READ Saskatoon, along with its partners Affinity Credit Union and Kinsmen Club of Saskatoon, raised over \$49,000 for literacy in Saskatoon last week, through the 4<sup>th</sup> annual READ Saskatoon PGI Golf Tournament.
