RAPP With READ

READ Saskatoon's RAPP collection consists of children's books and resources that organizations can borrow for the families they work with.

Schools, agencies or daycares that would like to access the RAPP collection may take out a yearly Family Literacy Membership.

Membership also includes access to the Storybag collection and *Come Read With Me* library at READ Saskatoon.

It is recommended that Storybag users have the *Introduction to Family Literacy Certificate* which is offered at no charge throughout the year.

Reading And Parents Program

Who is RAPP for?

- Parents and caregivers of preschoolers
- Parents who want ideas to make reading with their child more effective
- Parents who want to give their children a better start
- Daycares, preschools and community groups who would like to host Family Literacy programs

How does RAPP work?

- Parents and caregivers of preschoolers borrow the RAPP pack and take it home to work on as a family.
- Every 2 weeks, parents return the pack to the coordinator and exchange for a new one.
- Parents return the books and the pack folder each week but can keep all handouts, craft ideas and tip sheets from every pack.

What is RAPP?

- The READ Saskatoon Reading and Parents Program is a free bi-weekly program for parents who access Family Literacy programs.
- Parents use books, songs, and rhymes to introduce children to pre-reading skills at home.
- RAPP helps parents in their role as their child's first and most important teacher.

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
